CAUCUS STARTED AT 7:04 PM. MAYOR PIASECKI WENT OVER THE AGENDA FOR THE COUNCIL MEETING. COUNCILMAN PERK ASKED THAT ORDINANCE 2015-3-2 (COUNCIL RULES) BE INTRODUCED BY ALL MEMBERS OF COUNCIL. COUNCILWOMAN JAKUBCZAK STATED IT HAS BEEN A WHILE SINCE COUNCIL RULES HAVE BEEN CHANGED. WE WILL NEED TO THINK ABOUT HOW TO DOLE OUT COMMITTEES NEXT YEAR WHEN COUNCIL IS REDUCED TO FIVE MEMBERS. MAYOR PIASECKI STATED THAT THE OHIO REVISED CODE AND OUR ORDINANCES REFER TO A MAJORITY AND A 2/3 MAJORITY. THE LAW DIRECTOR WILL NEED TO CLARIFY THIS AND ISSUE AN OPINION WITH THE SMALLER COUNCIL NEXT YEAR. MAYOR PIASECKI STATED THAT ORDINANCE 2015-3-3 IS FOR A SECURITY SYSTEM FOR THE COMMUNITY CENTER AND POLICE DEPARTMENT. HE WENT TO THE RECREATION BOARD AND PRESENTED IT TO THEM TO GET THEIR BLESSING. ORDINANCE 2015-3-4 IS FOR A RESIDENTIAL REBATE IN 2015. COUNCILWOMAN DROCKTON ASKED CLERK TOMASKO WHY SHE HAD TO SIGN CHECKS FOR THE 2014 REBATE LAST MONTH? CLERK TOMASKO REPLIED THAT THERE ARE A NUMBER OF PEOPLE WHO DID NOT CASH THEIR CHECKS LAST YEAR AND WHEN WE PURSUED IT WE FOUND THAT THEY HAD LOST THEIR CHECKS, ETC. SO WE HAVE TO VOID AND RE-ISSUE THEM. THIS IS AN ONGOING PROCESS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR. ENGINEER SCIANO STATED THAT ORDINANCE 2015-3-5 IS FOR A NEW STORM WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN. SOME OF IT IS BOILERPLATE BUT TAILORED TO VALLEY VIEW. IT GIVES THE VALLEY VIEW PLANNING COMMISSION A LOT OF FLEXIBILITY AND ENFORCES HOW WORK IS DONE IN THE VILLAGE. IT TIES THE PERMIT TO THE WORK AND ALLOWS THE LAW DIRECTOR TO LEGALLY ENFORCE IT. COUNCILWOMAN MALICKI ASKED HOW DOES THIS AFFECT THE SWAIL BETWEEN MURRAY AND FOSDICK? ENGINEER SCIANO STATED IT IS TWO SEPARATE ISSUES. THIS ORDINANCE IS FOR PEOPLE WHO WANT TO DEVELOP IN VALLEY VIEW AND THE RETENTION REQUIREMENTS. IT WILL LET DEVELOPERS KNOW WHAT IS EXPECTED OF THEM AND GIVES US AN ENFORCEMENT TOOL. IT IS A PIECE OF LEGISLATION THAT CONNECTS VALLEY VIEW WITH THE EPA. MAYOR PIASECKI ASKED WHAT ABOUT THE RIPARIAN ORDINANCE THAT WE PASSED IN 2013? ENGINEER SCIANO STATED THAT PART OF THAT IS INCLUDED IN THIS ORDINANCE. HE SUGGESTED PUTTING IT ON FIRST READING UNTIL THE LAW DIRECTOR GETS BACK. CAUCUS ENDED AT 7:15 PM.

March 2015 Council Meeting Report to Council

To: Council and Administration
From: Mayor Jerry Piasecki
Re: March Report to Council

Salt Shortage/ Winter Operations:

Our salt supplier, Cargill notified us on Thursday February 19 of a shortage that would affect salt deliveries. At that point we were already shorted by 300 tons of missed deliveries. Shortly after, Cargill notified us that deliveries would be scheduled soon with limited supply. We then decided to close Morningside Drive and Valley View Woods along with other salt conservation methods. This conserved salt without compromising safety on the hills and intersections. A Swiftreach message was sent to residents as notification of the closings. This action lasted only several days as no major storms developed. Our residents understand situations arise and were very complimentary. Our Service Department and Safety forces have done a terrific job during a record-breaking winter weather season.

Department Meetings:

February 24th marked our first monthly Departmental meeting. There were several items brought to the table, if you are interested in the issues we discussed I will send you an informal agenda and list of items discussed. The time and effort proved to be well worth continuing meeting on a regular basis.

CHS Prom Promise Event:

Valley View Safety Forces will host this year's "Prom Promise" event. If you have attended one of these in our tri-community you realize the reality of the event content. The "play acting" hits home with students and parents alike. The event includes a life-flight landing and on scene EMT / Paramedics. It's quite a real-life presentation designed to display a sobering reality we pray never happens.

DOPWIC (Department of Public Works Integrating Committee):

This month's Mayors and City Managers meeting hosted representatives of DOPWIC. Their presentation highlighted a new evaluation system focused on fairness to all Cuyahoga County municipalities for 2016 infrastructure project grant dollars. Our engineer and I will be focusing on the system revisions in order to present a detailed and competitive project presentation to the committee. There are several key components that if emphasized can have a notable difference for a favorable award. We are going to be placing a concerted effort into a highly technical presentation, which will compete against projects from other Cuyahoga County cities.

Home day 2015:
