CAUCUS STARTED AT 7:05 PM. MAYOR PIASECKI INTRODUCED MR. JIM ZWISLER, THE FACILITATOR OF THE CUYAHOGA HEIGHTS SCHOOLS BEST COMMITTEE. MR. ZWISLER INTRODUCED STUDENT PRESENTER ALYSSA BERNSTEIN, CHS TEACHER JUDY HARVAN, BOARD MEMBER VICKIE BOWDEN, AND ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PRINCIPAL JOY HOUCHEM. HE TALKED ABOUT THE PARCC TESTING WHICH WAS ANNOUNCED JUST BEFORE CHRISTMAS. THERE ARE TWO CATEGORIES – PERFORMANCE AND END OF YEAR ASSESSMENT. IN GRADES 3 THRU 8 STUDENTS HAD 48 STRAIGHT DAYS OF TESTING. THIS MEANS TIME IS TAKEN AWAY FROM INSTRUCTION FOR TESTING. CHS SCHOOLS IS A PREMIER DISTRICT IN RELATION TO PREPAREDNESS FOR PARCC. THE TEST RESULTS WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE UNTIL NEXT JANUARY. A FINAL REPORT TO THE DISTRICT AND BOARD OF EDUCATION IS JUNE 10<sup>TH</sup>.

MAYOR PIASECKI WENT OVER THE AGENDA FOR THE COUNCIL MEETING. ORDINANCE 2015-4-7 IS ON SECOND READING. THE MAYOR IS WAITING ON APPROVAL/DENIAL OF THIS ORDINANCE FOR THE NEW POLICY AND PROCEDURE MANUAL. ORDINANCE 2015-5-7 IS ACCEPTING A BID FOR THE OLD ROCKSIDE ROAD BRIDGE. COUNCILMAN WESTFALL ASKED IF WE CAN PUT THIS ON FIRST READING AND TALK TO THE CITY OF INDEPENDENCE ABOUT SHARING SOME OF THE COST. MAYOR PIASECKI STATED THAT HE HAS ALREADY TALKED TO INDEPENDENCE. THEY WERE NOT AGREEABLE TO SHARING THE COST. ENGINEER SCIANO STATED THAT IF WE APPROVE THIS IT WOULD NOT STOP US FROM TALKING TO INDEPENDENCE AGAIN NOW THAT WE HAVE THE BIDS. MAYOR PIASECKI STATED HE ADDRESSED THIS OUT OF THE GATE WITH MAYOR KURTZ AT THE LAST MAYOR AND MANAGERS MEETING. THEY DID NOT OFFER ANYTHING. MAYOR PIASECKI STATED THAT WE WILL NEED A MOTION TO SUSPEND THE 72 HOUR RULE FOR RESOLUTION 2015-5-9 AND ORDINANCE 2015-5-10 SINCE THEY WERE LATE ENTRIES TO THE AGENDA. CAUCUS ENDED AT 7:25 PM.

COUNCILMAN PERK STATED THAT AT THE LAST RECREATION BOARD MEETING HE MADE SOME COMMENTS THAT HE WOULD LIKE PUT IN THE COUNCIL MINUTES.

**MAYOR PIASECKI OPENED THE MEETING TO THE PUBLIC.**

MR. MYRON NAGORSKI OF SWEET VALLEY DRIVE STATED THAT COMMERCIAL PEOPLE ARE DOING LAWNS ON THE WEEKENDS (SUNDAYS). HE GETS ONLY ONE DAY OF PEACE PER WEEK. HE COMMENDED THE NEW POLICE OFFICERS THAT HAVE RESPONDED TO HIS COMPLAINTS. MONTHS AGO HE PASSED OUT A PACKET CONCERNING THE BEEPING NOISE FROM BOYAS. HE THANKED THE MAYOR, COUNCILMAN WYATT AND PERK FOR THEIR HELP IN THE PAST. HE COMPLAINED ABOUT THE TRUCK TRAFFIC GOING PAST HIS HOUSE. HE COMPLAINED ABOUT DAVEY TREE TRIMMING TREES IN THE FRONT OF HIS PROPERTY.

MAYOR PIASECKI SAID HE WILL LOOK AT THE NOISE ORDINANCE AND REVIEW IT WITH MR. NAGORSKI.

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MR. NAGORSKI SAID THERE IS TRUCK TRAFFIC FROM BOYAS, AND WATER DEPARTMENT TRUCKS. THE ASPHALT IS BREAKING UP WHERE IT MEETS THE CONCRETE. THE TRUCKS START AT 6AM. HE WANTS TO STOP THE TRUCKS THAT DON'T NEED TO BE THERE.

MAYOR PIASECKI ASKED CHIEF MARCH HOW MANY CITATIONS HAVE BEEN ISSUED IN SWEET VALLEY?

CHIEF MARCH SAID HE WILL HAVE TO LOOK IT UP.

MAYOR PIASECKI STATED THAT IT CAN'T BE PATROLED 24 HOURS PER DAY.

MR. ROCCO CASADONTE OF ALDERSYDE DRIVE SAID THAT AT THE END OF ALDERSYDE WE NEED TO POST A SIGN (TEN FEET FROM THE END) TO SAY "NO PARKING". YOU HAVE TROUBLE SEEING THE CARS COMING.

MAYOR PIASECKI STATED HE WOULD HAVE THE POLICE CHIEF AND SERVICE FOREMAN LOOK INTO IT.

MR. MARLO TERMINI OF SOUTH PARTRIDGE SAID THAT HE LIVED IN GARFIELD HEIGHTS FOR 30 YEARS, 15 YEARS FROM THE END OF THE LANDFILL. HE SAID MEETING ADVERSITY WELL IS A SOURCE OF YOUR STRENGTH. HE EXTOLLED THE SERVICES OF THIS COMMUNITY. THE PAST YEAR THE EMS, POLICE, MR. HARTER, AND MR. VON VILLE HAVE HELPED HIM IMMENSLY. HE MADE A SMALL DONATION FOR TRANSPORTATION AND THE FLOWER FUND. HE MADE A CHOICE 18 YEARS AGO TO SETTLE IN VALLEY VIEW. WHAT A DIFFERENCE IT HAS MADE TO HIS FAMILY. HE THANKED ROCCO CASADONTE FOR HIS SERVICE TO THE RECREATION PROGRAM. HE WOULD LIKE TO GET A PHYSICAL THERAPY PROGRAM FOR SENIORS. YOU CANNOT RELY ON THE SERVICES AT CUYAHOGA HEIGHTS SCHOOLS. IT IS HARD TO SCHEDULE. HE ASKED ABOUT THE PROGRESS ON HATHAWAY PRESERVES?

MAYOR PIASECKI STATED THAT THE DEVELOPER CAME TO THE PLANNING BOARD LAST MONTH AND IT WAS NOT APPROVED. THERE ARE 19 SINGLE FAMILY HOMES PLANNED.

MR. TERMINI STATED HE WOULD LIKE TO GET SOMETHING BUILT IN VALLEY VIEW FOR SENIORS. IT IS ONE OF THE FASTEST GROWING INDUSTRIES.

MR. MARK MAZUR OF BROCKWAY DRIVE ASKED IF THE ENGINEER HAD BEEN OVER TO LOOK AT THE EROSION PROBLEM BEHIND THE HOMES ON BROCKWAY?

ENGINEER SCIANO STATED THAT HE HAS LOOKED AT THE AREA AND IT IS IN THE REALM OF WHAT WE ARE STUDYING RIGHT NOW.

## **May 2015 Council Meeting Report to Council**

Re: May Report to Council

### **Dispatch Update:**

Six Neighboring Mayors met in an effort to explore options of creating a regional approach to Police and Fire dispatch services. This effort is parallel to the efforts of the county to regionalize dispatch service. As you know, the groundbreaking in Broadview Heights last month spearheads the county effort for our region. We will be looking for the most efficient yet best service for our dollar, we cannot sacrifice quality for price.

### **CHS 2015 Prom Promise Event:**

Since the report last month that this year's Prom Promise would be held in Brooklyn Heights, I've been notified that Valley View will host the 2015 event. Chief March will present an update at our May Council meeting. The event is scheduled for May 14<sup>th</sup> at 11:00am at Valley View Woods.

### **Riverview & Stone Bridges:**

Our efforts to place landscape planters and design posts at the Riverview and Stone Bridge entrances were not approved by Cuyahoga County Department of Public works, Bridge Division. Instead they decided to erect their own version of barriers. The County owns these structures and claims they have observed vehicles crossing the bridges, especially at Stone Road. I have met twice with the county in an attempt to find middle ground for a proper and pleasingly designed obstruction that would allow emergency access. Chief Koscielski attempted to present the importance of emergency access as has the National Park, however as of now, the county will not consider allowing the passage of vehicles only pedestrian and bike traffic. We do have an acceptable preliminary design; but it comes with a cost since the county will not bear the initial cost of installation. I understand that the National Park is pursuing other options with the county so I would suggest approving the funds but to not proceed until I hear from the Park, hopefully soon. This is a sensitive political issue and in order to achieve success we must use a careful approach so please be patient. My most recent discussion with the county (Tuesday May 5<sup>th</sup> at 1pm) may have opened up a fresh look to our approach for design and installation. We may be able to fabricate the guardrail barriers with Village labor.

### **Road Repairs (General):**

Our harsh winter was tough on roadways this year, Valley View is no exception. Engineer Sciano and I will be travelling each and every roadway together in order to identify areas that need repair. A report to the RTU committee and Council members is forthcoming. The committee has already recognized the need and made some priority changes in order to balance funds. We will also be discussing signal timing.

I would like to take this time to thank Mayor Piasecki, Recreation Director Todd Von Ville, Engineer Todd Sciano, Clerk Carol Tomasko, Law Director Dave Lambros and CHS Superintendent Joe Bergant for all the help they gave me in preparing all the information I needed to address the questions and concerns of board member Don Paulson and the recreation board regarding the proposed splash park for our village. The information was provided timely and submitted to members of the recreation board before the scheduled meeting April 16, 2015.

I also took the opportunity to speak to a school board member and to the acting Superintendent of the Cuyahoga Heights Schools who both are of the opinion that the splash park would be an asset to our community and to the school district in attracting young families.

I am disappointed that the majority of the recreation board members are not available for this scheduled meeting. Once again, this issue will be delayed by the recreation board even though I have made every attempt to answer all questions and concerns.

I have provided all costs for construction, maintenance, insurance, employee coverage etc. and I compromised on the location especially since construction in Valley View Woods would be less expensive than construction at the Community Center. I have also taken into account and made it clear that no other programs or services to our residents would be reduced or eliminated due to the splash park. It will be an added asset for the children of our village.

I would greatly appreciate a decision from the recreation board by the next board meeting.  
Councilman Tom Perk
