CAUCUS STARTED AT 7:08 PM. MAYOR PIASECKI WENT OVER THE AGENDA FOR THE COUNCIL MEETING. HE ANNOUNCED THAT COUNCILWOMAN JAKUBCZAK WOULD NOT BE AT THE CAUCUS BUT SHE WILL BE HERE FOR THE COUNCIL MEETING. MAYOR PIASECKI STATED THAT ORDINANCE 2015-9-9 (INCOME TAX ORDINANCE) REFERS TO AN EXHIBIT "A". SHOULD THAT APPEAR SOMEWHERE ON THE ATTACHMENT? CLERK TOMASKO STATED THAT SHE WOULD ADD IT. THE MAYOR ALSO STATED THAT PAGES 4 AND 14 SEEM REPETITIVE. LAW DIRECTOR LAMBROS STATED THAT THIS IS THE MODEL ORDINANCE FROM RITA. THERE WAS ALSO A MODEL FROM THE OHIO MUNICIPAL LEAGUE. THESE ARE THEIR DEFINITIONS. WE JUST CUSTOMIZED THE PARTS THAT PERTAIN TO VALLEY VIEW. COUNCILWOMAN MALICKI STATED THAT ORDINANCE 2015-9-13 (PARKING) SHOULD STAY ON SECOND READING. SHE WILL SEND HER CHANGES TO THE LAW DIRECTOR FOR THE NOVEMBER MEETING. ORDINANCE 2015-10-4 IS A MOU (MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING) WITH THE CLEVELAND CLINIC FOR A MOBILE STROKE UNIT. IT IS A NEW UNIT WITH DEDICATED STAFF AND EQUIPMENT TO HANDLE STROKE VICTIMS. COUNCILWOMAN DROCKTON STATED THAT SHE WOULD LIKE RESOLUTION 2015-10-5 (MONEY TO RENOVATE COUNCIL CHAMBERS) ON FIRST READING BECAUSE SHE WOULD LIKE TO SEE SOME PLANS AND SAMPLES. CAUCUS ENDED AT 7:16 PM.

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ORDINANCE: 2015-10-4

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT AND PARTICIPATE WITH THE CLEVELAND CLINIC FOUNDATION ("CCF") IN CONNECTION WITH CCF'S IMPLEMENTATION OF A MOBILE STROKE TREATMENT UNIT IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE VILLAGE OF VALLEY VIEW'S FIRE DEPARTMENT (EMS) WAS READ BY TITLE ONLY AND INTRODUCED BY MAYOR PIASECKI.

FIRE CHIEF KOSCIELSKI STATED THAT THIS IS A MOBILE UNIT, LIKE A TRANSPORTATION BUS. A STROKE ALERT IS SENT TO DISPATCH AND A VALLEY VIEW AMBULANCE AND THIS UNIT IS SENT AT THE SAME TIME. IT GIVES THE PATIENT AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE GIVEN A CAT SCAN RIGHT IN THEIR OWN DRIVEWAY. DEPENDING ON WHAT THE CAT SCAN SHOWS – WHETHER A BLOCK OR BLEED- DEPENDS ON WHERE THEY ARE TRANSPORTED. INDEPENDENCE USED THE UNIT A MONTH OR SO BACK. THE FEMALE PATIENT WAS TREATED IN HER DRIVEWAY. CLEVELAND CLINIC INITIATED STROKE PROTOCOL AND TREATMENT WAS ADMINISTERED WITHIN 23 MINUTES. THAT IS FROM THE TIME THE CALL CAME IN. THE UNIT HAS A DESIGNATED DOCTOR, NURSE AND CAT SCAN SPECIALIST. IT SHORTENS RECOVERY TIME. THAT IS THAT GOLDEN "ONE HOUR" THAT WE HAVE TO TREAT STROKE VICTIMS. RIGHT NOW THERE IS ONE BUS THAT IS USED FROM 8AM TO 8PM DAILY. THERE IS A SECOND BUS UNDER CONSTRUCTION AND HOPES ARE THAT IT WILL BE HOUSED IN THE INDEPENDENCE FIRE STATION. THAT WILL SHORTEN RESPONSE TIME IN THIS AREA. THE CHIEF STATED HE COULD GET THE CLINIC TO BRING A BUS TO VALLEY VIEW FOR A DEMO. VALLEY VIEW CANNOT USE THE UNIT UNTIL WE PASS THIS ORDINANCE. THERE IS ALSO A BILLING AGREEMENT THAT THE MAYOR, LAW DIRECTOR AND MYSELF HAVE TO REVIEW. WE WILL BILL FOR WHAT WE DO AND THE CLINIC WILL BILL FOR WHAT THEY DO. IT IS A STATE OF THE ART WAY TO HANDLE STROKES. WE HAVE BEEN TRYING TO DO THIS SINCE JULY.

MAYOR PIASECKI ASKED WHAT IS THE PROTOCOL IF TWO CITIES CALL FOR THE UNIT SINCE IT CANNOT BE IN TWO PLACES AT ONCE.

FIRE CHIEF KOSCIELSKI STATED THAT VALLEY VIEW PERSONNEL WERE TRAINED IN CLEVELAND CLINIC STROKE PROTOCOL THRU MARYMOUNT. THEY ARE A CERTIFIED STROKE CENTER. WE WOULD TRANSPORT TO THE NEAREST STROKE CENTER.

MAYOR PIASECKI ASKED HOW LONG HAS THE UNIT BEEN IN OPERATION?

FIRE CHIEF KOSCIELSKI STATED SINCE LAST OCTOBER. IT WAS ONLY ALLOWED TO GO TO GARFIELD AND CLEVELAND EMS. IT WILL START TO SEE A LOT MORE USE AS MORE CITIES GET ON BOARD.

COUNCILWOMAN JAKUBCZAK ASKED DOES THE UNIT HAVE TO TRANSPORT TO A CLEVELAND CLINIC HOSPITAL?

FIRE CHIEF KOSCIELSKI STATED THAT IT MOST LIKELY WILL TAKE YOU TO THE CLEVELAND CLINIC MAIN CAMPUS BECAUSE IT IS THEIR BUS. AFTER THE PATIENT IS STABLE THEY CAN BE TRANSPORTED TO ANY HOSPITAL.

MOVED BY PERK, SECONDED BY DROCKTON, TO SUSPEND THE RULES AND PLACE ORDINANCE 2015-10-4 ON THIRD AND FINAL READING.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO UPDATE THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS AT AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED FORTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$40,000.00) IN THE VILLAGE OF VALLEY VIEW, OHIO WAS READ BY TITLE ONLY AND INTRODUCED BY MAYOR PIASECKI.

THIS RESOLUTION IS ON FIRST READING.

MAYOR PIASECKI STATED THAT HE HAS BEEN ASKED TO PROVIDE MORE DETAILS TO COUNCIL REGARDING THE RENOVATION. HE HAS BEEN DISCUSSING THIS PROJECT WITH BUILDING COMMISSIONER ELLIS AND CLERK TOMASKO FOR SEVERAL MONTHS. THE TWO MAJOR ITEMS – THE CARPET AND WALL COVERINGS WILL BE DONE BY OUTSIDE CONTRACTORS. THE TRIM, FIXTURES AND MISC WORK WILL BE DONE BY OUR SERVICE DEPARTMENT DURING THE WINTER MONTHS.

ORDINANCE: 2015-10-6

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXPEND FUNDS NOT TO EXCEED \$40,000.00 FOR THE STUDY OF THE EROSION AND STABILITY OF THE STRATHMORE SUBDIVISION EROSION – PHASE 1 PLAN WAS READ BY TITLE ONLY AND INTRODUCED BY MAYOR PIASECKI.

ENGINEER SCIANO STATED THAT THE FIRST STEP WILL BE TO DO TEST BORES IN AND AROUND THE HOMES ON BROCKWAY ACCORDING TO THE ATTACHED MAP. WE WILL GET AS CLOSE AS WE CAN TO THE BACK YARD BUT SOME WILL HAVE TO BE PUSHED INTO THE FRONT YARD. WE WILL MIRROR THE SOILS AT THE SAME STRATIFICATION AT THE TOP AS IN THE LOWER VALLEY. THEY WILL STUDY THOSE FIVE SECTIONS SPECIFICALLY FOR THOSE FIVE HOMES THAT YOU SEE ON THE STRAIGHT AWAY OF BROCKWAY. THEN WE WILL DO A COST/BENEFIT RATIO TO SEE WHAT THE BEST SOLUTIONS FOR STABILIZATION WILL BE SO WE CAN MOVE FORWARD WITH A PLAN ON HOW TO MAKE A REPAIR.

MAYOR PIASECKI STATED THAT WILL TELL YOU WHAT DESIGN CRITERIA YOU ARE GOING TO USE. IS THAT WHAT YOU ARE SAYING?

ENGINEER SCIANO REPLIED THAT IS CORRECT. IF IT IS A SHEET PILING WALL WHAT WILL THE LOADING HAVE TO BE AGAINST THAT WALL. IF IT IS A TIMBER WALL WHAT ARE THE HYDRAULICS, WHERE IS THE WATER TABLE. WHAT THE SOILS ARE IN THE LOADING BEHIND THE WALL. MAYBE NONE OF THOSE WALLS ARE EVEN AN OPTION. MAYBE IT IS A CULVERT OR SOME OTHER VERSION LIKE WE TALKED ABOUT LIKE PIPING OR CHANNELING. THIS IS THE BEGINNING OF THE PERMITTING PROCESS. THIS PIECE WILL PROBABLY TIE INTO AN ARMY CORPS PIECE FOR APPROVAL TO WORK IN THERE.

MAYOR PIASECKI STATED LEWIN IS DOING THE TEST BORES. ARE THEY GOING TO SUGGEST ENGINEERING?

ENGINEER SCIANO STATED THEY WILL SUGGEST REMEDIATION OPTIONS THAT WE WILL BE ABLE TO REVIEW.

MAYOR PIASECKI REPLIED NOT SPECIFICS BUT JUST TYPES?

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ENGINEER SCIANO REPLIED JUST TYPES AGAINST THAT LOADING. WE WILL ALSO USE A LITTLE BIT OF THIS MONEY TO RESTORE THE FRONT YARDS THAT MIGHT GET RUTTED UP BY THE DRILL RIG. IT WILL PROBABLY BE DONE WITH SOME LOCAL LANDSCAPE COMPANIES.

NEW BUSINESS FROM THE MAYOR:

MAYOR PIASECKI STATED THAT WE OPENED BIDS FOR A NEW VAN FOR USE IN THE RECREATION DEPARTMENT. THERE WAS AN OPTION THAT WE HAD NOT CONSIDERED FOR MOVABLE SEATS. WE WILL RE-BID AND HOPEFULLY HAVE SOMETHING TO BRING TO COUNCIL IN NOVEMBER.

MAYOR PIASECKI COMMENDED THE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND SPECIFICALLY PTL. GLENN DUGAS AND THE CHIEF FOR HOSTING A BUSINESS WATCH LUNCHEON. WE HAD 52 BUSINESSES WHO ATTENDED. THE PROGRAM IS INTENDED TO IMPROVE COMMUNICATIONS BETWEEN THE VILLAGE AND OUR BUSINESS BASE.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

CLERK-TREASURER TOMASKO GAVE THE MAYOR AND ALL MEMBERS OF COUNCIL A STATEMENT OF CASH POSITION REPORT FOR THE PERIOD ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2015.

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BEAUTIFICATION (MALICKI) – NO REPORT

BUILDING & MAINTENANCE (WYATT) - NO REPORT.

HUMAN SERVICES/OFFICE SERVICES (JAKUBCZAK) - NO REPORT.

SCHOOL (LIASON) (DROCKTON) - NO REPORT.

POLICE CHIEF MARCH HAD HIS REPORT.

FIRE CHIEF KOSCIELSKI HAD HIS REPORT.

THE CHIEF GAVE EACH OF COUNCIL A LETTER PERTAINING TO ISO AND HE WANTED TO EXPLAIN WHAT HAPPENED. THE OLD ISO PROGRAM WAS BASED ON EQUIPMENT, RESPONSE TIME AND WATER AVAILABILITY. IT WAS 35 TO 40 YEARS OLD. THE NEW PROGRAM CAME INTO EFFECT A LITTLE OVER A YEAR AGO AND THE NEW PERSON PLANS ON VISITING ALL COMMUNITIES NO MORE THAN 5 YEARS APART. IT USED TO BE THAT A VILLAGE WAS LOOKED AT ONCE EVERY 15 YEARS. NOW IT IS EVERY 5 YEARS. THE WHOLE PROGRAM HAS BEEN BASED DIFFERENTLY. IT IS NOW BASED ON TRAINING HOURS, INSPECTION PROGRAMS, HYDRANTS, HOSE TESTING, NUMBER OF HOURS EACH MAN PUTS IN WHETHER THEY ARE FULL-TIME OR PART-TIME, NUMBER OF MEN ON SHIFT, MUTUAL AID CALLS AND RESPONSE TIME FROM OTHER DEPARTMENTS TO A FIRE. YOU HAVE TO HAVE 14 MEN ON A SCENE IN 8 MINUTES. ALL THE RE-EVALUATION WAS DONE BY THIS NEW PERSON AND WE SAT WITH HIM FOR 6 ½ HOURS GOING THRU FILES AND COMPUTER RECORDS. WE DID LEARN FROM IT. THERE ARE SOME THINGS WE NEED TO GET BETTER AT AND WE HAVE ALREADY IMPLEMENTED THOSE TO GIVE US A BETTER SCORE. OUT OF THE EVALUATION WITH 1 BEING EXEMPLARY AND 10 BEING THE WORST, WE WENT FROM A 5 TO A 3. OUR COMMERCIAL INDUSTRY WILL BENEFIT FROM THIS WITH THEIR INSURANCE RATING. A LOT OF IT HAD TO DO WITH THE DATA WE PRESENTED TO THEM. HE IS PROUD TO GO FROM A 5 TO A 3.

BUILDING COMMISSIONER ELLIS HAD HIS REPORT.

STREET COMMISSIONER SOLDAT HAD NO REPORT.

RECREATION DIRECTOR VON VILLE HAD HIS REPORT.

THE CHILDREN'S HALLOWEEN PARTY WILL BE HELD AT THE COMMUNITY CENTER ON OCTOBER 24TH FROM 1-3PM. DIRECTOR VON VILLE THANKED THE GROUNDSKEEPERS AND FIRE DEPARTMENT FOR THEIR HELP WITH THE ANNUAL GEORGE GROSS INVITATIONAL HELD AT VALLEY VIEW WOODS.

MAYOR PIASECKI STATED THAT WE ARE LOOKING AT CHANGING THE SIGN OUTSIDE OF THE COMMUNITY CENTER TO A DIGITAL ONE. WE GOT A COUPLE OF QUOTES ON IT. IN THE MEANTIME THE VALLEY VIEW MEN'S CLUB ASKED TO BE PART OF THE PROJECT SO WE ARE WAITING TO SEE WHAT THEIR SHARE WILL BE.

ENGINEER SCIANO HAD HIS REPORT.

THE OLD ROCKSIDE ROAD BRIDGE HAS BEEN OPENED. THE CONTRACTOR DID A GOOD JOB. WE ARE WRAPPING UP THE STRATHMORE PAVEMENT PROJECT.

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THERE SHOULD BE A LOT OF ACTION ON STONE ROAD IN THE NEXT TWO WEEKS.

MAYOR PIASECKI STATED THAT HE HEARD THAT ON MONDAY THERE WILL BE TONS OF EQUIPMENT ON STONE ROAD.

ENGINEER SCIANO STATED WE HAD SOME ISSUES WITH SOME OF THE UTILITIES WITH THE THREE PROPERTIES ON THE EASTERN END OF THE ROAD BECAUSE OF THE GRADE. HE THANKED THE PROPERTY OWNERS FOR WORKING WITH HIM TO RESOLVE THOSE ISSUES.

NEW BUSINESS FROM COUNCIL:

COUNCILWOMAN MALICKI ASKED ABOUT THE INVOICING FOR THE EMERGENCY TREE SERVICE. EACH ONE DOES NOT ALWAYS SAY THE REASON WHY THE TREE WAS REMOVED. SOME DO NOT EVEN STATE THE LOCATION. COULD THAT BE MARKED ON THE INVOICE?

MAYOR PIASECKI STATED THAT SOMETIMES THE TREES ARE BY THE SIDE OF A ROAD SO THERE IS NO ADDRESS. IT MIGHT BE ALONG THE NATIONAL PARK OR ALONG HILLSIDE. BUT WE CAN INSTRUCT THEM TO PUT THE REASON FOR REMOVAL ON THE INVOICE.

COUNCILMAN WYATT ASKED BUILDING COMMISSIONER ELLIS ABOUT THE HOUSE ON MORNINGSIDE THAT WAS DISCUSSED LAST MONTH AT THE MEETING. DOES HE HAVE AN UPDATE?

BUILDING COMMISSIONER ELLIS STATED THAT HE HAD BEEN IN CONTACT WITH THE PROPERTY MANAGEMENT COMPANY EVEN BEFORE THE LAST COUNCIL MEETING AND HE GAVE THEM A LIST OF THE VIOLATIONS ON THE PROPERTY. THEY HAD TO WAIT TO GET APPROVAL FROM THE BANK. THEY WILL BE ADDRESSING THE VIOLATIONS THIS WEEK. THEY HAVE BEEN CUTTING THE GRASS ON A REGULAR BASIS. A FORECLOSURE ON THE PROPERTY WAS FILED IN 2013. HE TALKED TO THE ATTORNEY FOR THE GENTLEMAN AND IF ALL GOES WELL IT SHOULD BE ON THE SHERIFF'S WEBSITE FOR AUCTION LATER THIS MONTH WITH THE ACTUAL AUCTION IN NOVEMBER.

MAYOR PIASECKI OPENED THE MEETING TO THE PUBLIC.

MR. CHESTER SOUKUP OF HATHAWAY ROAD WOULD LIKE THE VILLAGE TO RECOGNIZE THE FORMER VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS WHO WORKED FOR THE VILLAGE FOR A DOLLAR A YEAR, WITH MAYBE A PLAQUE AT THEIR WAKE. HE WOULD ALSO LIKE TO RECOGNIZE THE LADY VALLEY V'S WHO SERVED. THERE ARE STILL A LOT OF THE WOMEN ALIVE. THEY DESERVE SOMETHING.

MAYOR PIASECKI ASKED WHAT KIND OF RECOGNITION DO YOU SUGGEST?

MR. SOUKUP STATED JUST A PLAQUE. GIVEN AT THEIR WAKE. HE ASKED COUNCIL ONCE BEFORE BUT THEY WEREN'T SPENDING ANY MONEY. BUT NOW WE HAVE NEW TRUCKS AND CARS. GIVE THESE PEOPLE WHO WORKED FOR A DOLLAR A YEAR SOME RECOGNITION.

MAYOR PIASECKI STATED THAT WE DO SEND FLOWERS BUT WE HAVE OTHER DEPARTEMENTS IN THE VILLAGE THAT WE WOULD HAVE TO COORDINATE SOMETHING LIKE THAT FOR.

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COUNCILWOMAN JAKUBCZAK ASKED WAS THERE A VOLUNTEER POLICE DEPARTMENT?

MAYOR PIASECKI REPLIED NO.

COUNCILWOMAN JAKUBCZAK STATED SHE WOULD LOVE TO LOOK INTO THIS AND WORK WITH THE POLICE AND FIRE CHIEFS ON RECOGNIZING THEIR FORMER MEMBERS.

MAYOR PIASECKI ASKED COUNCILWOMAN JAKUBCZAK IF SHE WAS ON THE SAFETY COMMITTEE OR HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE?

COUNCILWOMAN JAKUBCZAK REPLIED THAT SHE IS ON THE HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE BUT SHE COULD ALSO MAKE IT WORK AS RESIDENT JULIE JAKUBCZAK.

MR. SOUKUP STATED THAT IN REGARDS TO THE PAVEMENT PROJECT ON STONE ROAD IS ANYONE AWARE THAT THE RESIDENTS AT THE EAST END OF THE STREET HAVE SPECIAL NEEDS? THAT THEIR MAIL BOX WILL NEED TO BE ADJUSTED ACCORDINGLY?

ENGINEER SCIANO STATED THAT HE WOULD LOOK INTO IT AND TAKE CARE OF IT.

MR. DAVE WINGENFELD OF TINKERS CREEK ROAD STATED THAT HE HOPES THE VILLAGE WILL CONSIDER ENERGY EFFICIENT LIGHTS AND SWITCHES IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS WHEN THEY REMODEL.

Re: October Report to Council

Court upholds NEORSD Stormwater :

The Ohio Supreme Court's ruling upholding the proposed stormwater fees will effect businesses and residents across the area. To clarify, Valley View was NOT part of the lawsuit. It is not yet clear whether the decision will be appealed. The fee structure established by NEORSD will remain intact however the actual effective date is to be determined. In February of 2013 (before the lawsuit) Council approved to establish a Stormwater User Fund to defray the costs of the program for residents. The amount established for 2013 was \$74,708. There are several outstanding issues with this program that require attention especially the unfair designations of impervious surfaces. I will be addressing these ongoing issues.

Village Van/ Bus:

Bids were received for the purchase of a new Van for the Recreation Dept. There was a bit of confusion regarding moveable seats and floor amenities therefore there will be a rebid process for the Van and hopefully we will be able to approve purchase of a new Van for the Recreation Department in November.

Bid criteria for a new large bus should be ready for Council to review by the December meeting. This would allow ample time for evaluating the criteria and approve a proper bidding process. Considering expected delivery requirements we should be ready to commit to purchase shortly after the New Year.

Summer Infrastructure Projects: *(Update on our three major projects)*

Old Rockside Bridge Replacement: The Old Rockside Bridge was opened to traffic at 10:00am on Sept 30th. Structure, presentation, and aesthetic value of the bridge provides a nice new look to the entire area.

Strathmore Drive Paving Project: Phase I of the Strathmore paving project is nearing completion within the next 2 weeks. Driveway aprons were poured on September 30. Remaining landscaping will follow along with the installation of mailboxes. Your support for replacement boxes is appreciated by all residents. As for the next Phase for paving, discussions with Engineer Sciano are working toward an earlier project next year. We are looking at starting late May and completing construction before school starts in order to avoid school bus interference.

Stone Road/ Donald Avenue Paving Project: The Stone Road/ Donald Avenue project appears to be moving slowly however the storm drainage work is pivotal to the main parts of the project. Once drainage is complete you will see significant progress on the main pavement portions.

Drone Legislation :

One of the astonishing contraptions technology has brought to our society are drones. Drones can be used for some deceitful purposes including harmful intentions to our Village property as well as invasion in our personal lives. Next month I will ask your support in passing legislation to limit use of these devices within our Village jurisdictional boundaries. Also, I have touched base with Mayor Bacci as to the possibility of addressing this issue with Cuyahoga Heights School. Any questions please see me at your convenience.

Historical Society :

Our Historical Society presented its first major event at the *Big Red Barn*. More than 115 attended the presentation. They heard interesting facts about Valley View's history. Many photos and historic maps were displayed. The added atmosphere of the barn added that old time flavor, making the event special. Many thanks to Dave Wingenfeld for hosting the event at the Barn.
