

# Curbside Recycling

**No separation required. Simply place all items in the recycling container.**

## Acceptable items include:

- All plastic bottles (no lids) such as milk jugs, soft drink, laundry detergent and shampoo bottles
- Glass jars and bottles of any color
- Aluminum, steel and empty aerosol cans with lids and tips removed
- Paper bags, envelopes with or without windows, junk mail, computer paper and other mixed office paper, magazines, telephone books, newspapers with inserts and catalogs
- Paperboard, such as cereal boxes
- Corrugated cardboard (flattened)

**\* Please rinse out all containers. You do NOT have to remove labels.**



## Recycling Benefits:

## Unacceptable items include:

- Plastics that are not bottles, such as whipped topping containers, buckets, butter tubs, food trays or yogurt cups
- Plastic bags
- Lids/caps
- Medical sharps and syringes\*
- Styrofoam
- Window or drinking glass and light bulbs
- Coat hangers, steel scrap, pots or pans
- Motor oil jugs, paint cans, or other chemical containers

\*Do not place medical sharps or medical waste inside of recyclables. For example, plastic containers being used to dispose of sharps should be placed with garbage only and are not recyclable. They may place employees who are sorting the material at risk of serious injury.
